....live in peace and rest. April 2019





'The Lord your God is giving you this land.

It's a place where you can make your homes and live in peace and rest.'

Joshua 1:13 (NIrV)

Somewhere to call home. Isn't that what we all want, need and perhaps take for granted? Recently we have been saddened, angered even, to learn of the imminent closure of two homes for people with learning disabilities and major decisions affecting the future of residents made apparently without consultation. Whilst financial pressures probably make closure inevitable, how can decisions be made without consultation or advocacy? Disabled people have needs and rights just like everyone else. Simply because some are less able to voice their thoughts and feelings, should they be ignored? Count Everyone In does not have a political agenda but every Christian has a mandate from God to speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves and to stand up for defenceless people. How are we affected by the news that disabled people are to lose the place they have called home maybe for 20+ years, and to be rehoused in an unfamiliar place, miles from people they have lived with and without the support of carers whom they trust to understand their ways and preferences.



We don't have the money or influence to change these decisions but we can all do something. Some may be able to lobby those in positions of authority but each one of us can pray and most can befriend. How about your church, and ours? Is it a church that engages with people regardless of any disability, recognising them as people made in God's image, to be valued as highly as anyone else, not ignored, simply tolerated or, worse still, subjected to discrimination? Not only do we want their personal, social and emotional lives to be highly regarded but also to provide for spiritual life, supporting people to access opportunities for Christian worship, teaching,

friendship and indeed to be embraced (not necessarily in a physical way – not everyone appreciates hugs!) into God's family, the church.



'Home for Good' is a Christian charity encouraging adoption and fostering and it is achieving much. Last Sunday a woman with a learning disability told us that she and her sister were abandoned by their mother when they were small children; one of them was moved from placement to placement whilst the other had been given a "home for good" – her words, not ours. What a difference that made to her stability and ability to cope with life in contrast to the insecurity of her sister. Thankfully, the lady to whom we were speaking has the additional advantage of being welcomed into God's family, the only one that guarantees an ultimate 'home for good'.

We mentioned last month that Count Everyone In is officially a charity, registration number 1181852. We are now applying to HMRC for CEI to be eligible for Gift Aid and we expect this to happen fairly quickly. That will enable supporters who don't currently give via our Stewardship account to have Gift Aid added to their donations if they choose to do so (and backdated to cover earlier years). As Count Everyone In will not be an employer Stewardship will still be the preferred way for giving to our personal support. We shall be writing to all supporters as things become clearer. Watch this space

Thank you for your prayers and support over the past month. It is hard to convey just how much it means to know that people are holding us up in prayer. A near collision on a busy roundabout recently reminded us of how dependent we are upon God for safety, not to mention health, finances and so much more.

March highlights included:

- meeting with our amazing Support Group followed by the first formal meeting of the CEI trustees
- the annual get-together of the Additional Needs Alliance core group; so good for lone workers to have mutual support, sharing inspiratio, frustration and experience
- our annual visit to Fenland Community Church, Cambridgeshire, always a pleasure
- planning for the holiday week at LPO, France in June with Keith, Gill and Janneke; so good when plans come together easily!
