Joy in heaven and on earth ... One man couldn't understand why there were so many beaming smiles and tear-stained cheeks that Friday morning. All he knew was that when he had arrived at his first CEI meeting on Monday, he didn't believe in Jesus but, by Thursday, everything had changed. In our sharing time that final morning at Keswick he testified to God having helped him to be brave enough to put his trust in Jesus. For the very first time he took bread and wine to remember what Jesus had done for him and his face radiated the joy that Jesus brings!





The week at Keswick was fun and fruitful but we were aware of spiritual attacks while the Holy Spirit was at work. Two team members sadly had to back out at short notice for reasons totally beyond their control but everyone pulled together and gaps were filled. The father of another team member was rushed to Carlisle hospital late one evening with suspected sepsis, only to be collected by Pete in the early hours of the following morning when a clearer diagnosis proved slightly less serious. Despite lack of sleep everything continued as planned.

A highlight was Wednesday evening when CEI guests as usual were invited to be onstage at the main celebration. Pete interviewed Janneke, whose main role for the week was that of Makaton signer, about the impact on her church of developing ministry with people with learning disabilities. We then taught the 3,000 strong congregation to sign the chorus of "O praise the name of the Lord our God" and sang it altogether with some meaningful movements that added to the sense of worship. We noticed that police officers had joined those standing at the back of the tent and apparently one of them was in tears! A typical comment from "Conventioners" was, "We always enjoy it when you guys are on stage but this year you truly led us in worship".



Know and Grow training

Training days at St Peter's Yateley and St Nic's Newbury were enthusiastically acclaimed and we look forward to seeing many of the delegates again on 12 October at Farnham Baptist Church where we shall be running the follow-on day. In the meantime, at St Nic's we shall be building up to the launch of Meet Monday on 7 October with lots to be done before then.

What's next?

Having arrived home from Keswick on Saturday, we shall be heading off again on Thursday to Cornwall for Creation Fest. Unlike last year, when we had no idea who would be allocated to the CEI team and no time in which to train/prepare them, this time we have been instrumental in recruiting four people who are already known to us and are experienced in this area of service. Time has been set aside on Friday morning for a training/briefing session and, although not everyone can be there in time, it will be good to prepare together where possible and to involve more of the team with upfront responsibilities. The theme is "Extra- Ordinary", looking at how God takes the ordinary and makes it extraordinary. If you're anywhere near Wadebridge, do call in and visit us in the Showcase Café from 11:00 to 12:30 Sunday to Friday. The event offers free entry unless you intend camping or caravanning on site and there is something for everyone (except, please note, children with additional needs – but we're encouraging Creation Fest to think about that for another time!).

Our final summer festival is Westpoint, the annual New Frontiers 'Commission' family weekend in Exeter from 22nd to 26th August. The theme is "Awe and Wonder" and our celebrations will be held in Tent 3: Friday 9:30-10:45; Saturday 9:30-10:45 and 19:00-21:00; Sunday 9:45-12:00. It's been great working with Janneke at the Newbury training day and at Keswick; now we look forward to having her on team at Exeter alongside other lovely, faithful team members. It will be good too to have David Barnett and the worship band from Bovey Tracey Baptist Church leading us once again. Entry is available to all but there is a daily charge of £45 for adult day visitors, or £35 for concessions.
