# But there is a friend .... May 2019






A person with unfaithful friends soon comes to ruin.

**Friends.** We all need them and most of us have them, just one or maybe more. Pete and I are blessed with always having been surrounded by good friends, those whose company we enjoy, people with whom we laugh, share concerns, sometimes weep together and at times give or receive words of gentle rebuke spoken in love. Just the other day we had a brief visit from a friend whom Christine has known since the age of 4; we hadn't seen her and her husband since the summer of 2017 but it could just as easily have been yesterday as we picked up effortlessly on previous conversations and shared history.



Friends. Some people have no friends or they have so-called friends who frequently disappoint, upset or even reject them. For people with learning disabilities whose social circle may be extremely limited this can be their experience and, as a result, they may feel lonely and isolated. Most readers will know that we are keen for churches to be more welcoming and accessible to everyone, especially those with learning disabilities, in main services and where possible in smaller groups too. Perhaps your church isn't able or ready to run such a group but had you thought instead about offering a safe place for a couple of hours a week, a comfortable room on church premises where people with learning disabilities can come for a tea or coffee (biscuits or cakes would be appreciated too!) and a chat? This is a project that will draw people from the margins into the warmth of the church family, helping your church to be a friendship hub where all are welcome. Just one word of caution though, be sure that such an activity meets the approval of your church's Safeguarding Officer. For guidelines,

# Friends with Count Everyone In

It was not our original intention to build a network of CEI groups but, in response to requests, we have a 'Friends with CEI' scheme up and running. It does not preclude any church or group from partnerships with other organisations but it does provide direct access to Count Everyone In which, for England and Wales, we believe to be the only nationwide Christian learning disability ministry support organisation. There is no set fee but we ask you to consider donations on an annual or monthly basis. As time goes on there will be more benefits to being 'friends with CEI' (such as branded clothing and access to a members-only section of the website) but, for the moment, we offer direct access for advice, specific prayer, a personal relationship with churches and groups, plus visits as appropriate to preach, speak etc. Please contact us if you are interested.
