He is thrilled to see how this Bible has helped and encouraged his brother. What great news!



Smiles - when

- a university student with autism found the CEI meetings welcoming and helpful - her favourite place at Word Alive
- at Word Alive service users and day centre staff heard the true meaning of Easter
- 40 people attended Pete's 'Missing People' seminar and stayed to talk about their church and family situations
- four people became Christians in the first celebration at Spring Harvest
- 123 people attended Janneke's Makaton signing workshop at Spring Harvest
- Janneke signed at the Worship for Everyone celebrations and many joined in
- the CEI exhibition stand at Spring Harvest attracted queues of enquirers

- our teams at Spring Harvest and Word Alive worked hard to serve our guests, even when they

- so few people with learning disabilities were in the meetings at Word Alive – but a total of 36 attended during the week

Thank you for your prayers for CEI at Word Alive and Spring Harvest. As you can see, blessings don't come without challenges but God is faithful. We did our part in declaring the good news of Jesus in easy-to-understand ways and God was at work as some people came to know Jesus as their Friend and Saviour and others grew in their faith.

Other events

Janneke delivered another Know and Grow Makaton workshop 'pilot' (please pray that it will soon cross the finishing line and be signed off) at Christ Church in Guildford, a church that is Friends with CEI. As a result of days like these, many people are signing, which makes the beautiful but complicated Christian language more accessible to more people. That's good!

At the 25th anniversary of the No Limits group in Southwick, Trowbridge, all 100 seats in the village hall were taken. This group is also Friends with CEI and Jacky Newman, the leader, is an active member of the Wiltshire Area Prayer and Encouragement Group. The theme was 'God loves everyone' and the afternoon concluded with a monologue from 'Commander Marcus Octavius' (aka Pete, complete with helmet and spear) and a challenging talk by Christine based on the healing of the centurion's servant. We sang and signed 'God loves you just the way you are' by Tony Phelps–Jones, who was there with his wife Tua.

In **Know and Grow 2** we move on to consider sensitive but important topics in relation to learning disability, including:

- relationships
- healing
- death, dying and bereavement
- boundaries

Know and Grow Makaton (pilot) continues to thrill, inspire and equip people. The day is fun and informative, equipping people to communicate and worship using simple key word signing.
