In February 2002 I very nervously started working for the charity called Prospects. I had no background in learning disability, yet had an overwhelming sense that God was calling me to commit myself to sharing the good news of Jesus with those who so often the church, as well as society, tried to ignore, and to equip churches to do the same. With the wise and gentle guidance of Tony Phelps-Jones and the Holy Spirit I learnt not just what to do but also to love what God had given me to do.

Then, on 1st May 2017 Christine and I, having once again heard the call of God, started a new charity 'Count Everyone In' and not long afterwards (by the end of 2018) we were joined by Janneke Klos. New chapters have opened along the way but still with a sense of real excitement.

New resources have been created, new training created, including Know & Grow Makaton (developed by Janneke in conjunction with and approved by The Makaton Charity) new challenges as we built new teams of volunteers and were invited over time to be involved in Spring Harvest, Spring Harvest Holidays, Keswick, Word Alive, Creation Fest, Commission (New Frontiers) and Catalyst (New Frontiers). As I look back there have also been many challenges, COVID, YouTube, filming, editing (thank you for those who helped) and things not always working out. The ups and the downs have come and gone. Following my treatment for Prostate Cancer my energy levels are still low. Yet I'm still excited about my faith as I serve the Lord. I'm hopeful and joyful. I'm learning to be patient and faithful.

I love what God has given me to do but would still love others to share the excitement and challenge. Could it be you? Let's talk!

A Christmas Celebration



Then a couple of weeks later, I joined Martyn Green and the Surrey groups in Chessington for their annual Alive Together conference and celebration event.

Both events were so full of joy and celebration for all the things that God has done in our lives, whilst also giving us an opportunity to learn more about what it means to be a friend of Jesus and live our lives as Christians.

In Cambridge, we looked at the story of Ruth and Naomi. Through worship, prayer, drama, signing and craft we learned about friendship. Just like Ruth was a good friend to Naomi, and Boaz was a good friend to both Naomi and Ruth, Jesus is our good friend. He is the friend who will never let us down, the friend we can always turn to, and the friend who will always help us.

At Alive Together we looked at the story of Joseph - the different groups all acted out parts of Joseph's story which helped us to learn more about forgiveness: God's forgiveness to us for all the things we have done wrong, but also about how we can forgive other people.


