Dear Friends.

Becoming CEI's sole employee has led to some interesting conversations. Most people, especially Christians, have been incredibly supportive and encouraging - and each one of you who has been praying for me and encouraging me through emails and messages: Thank you! But I've also had conversations with people who really struggled to understand the logic behind stepping off the career ladder in academia/social work to work for a Christian charity. The truth is, according to the world's standard of success, there is no logical reason to leave a profession that I enjoy and am passionate about, have all the qualifications for, and has good career prospects.

God's standards of success are not like the world's. The Bible is full of reminders that God doesn't care about our job titles, how much money we earn or have in our bank accounts, or how physically fit and beautiful we are. God cares about our hearts. His standard of success is our hearts being turned to Him, seeking His kingdom first, and desiring to do what He asks us to do. Living this out in a world that is so consumed by 'productivity' and worldly success is not always easy. In fact, it often is a daily decision to turn our eyes to God.

My friend Norman often encouraged me to live with my eyes focused on God's kingdom. Norman had a degenerative illness which limited his mobility and the range of motion in his limbs. One Sunday our pastor preached on Matthew 6:33-34, and at the end of the sermon, he encouraged the congregation to declare their willingness and desire to put God's Kingdom first and do whatever God was asking them to do. Norman's face took on a look of determination as he insisted that he was going to stand up (something he had not been able to do for years!). His carer panicked, but three men in the congregation did not. Together, we helped Norman to stand. As he looked up, pure joy radiated from his face and he said, "I don't care what people say about my legs. God can still use me."

Norman's ability to respond that Sunday morning didn't happen because of my job description, or because I am anything special. It happened because Norman's eyes were firmly fixed on Jesus, and that inspired me and the three men to do the same. Friends, this is the kind of success I long to see. Let's be a people willing to put down the trappings of worldly success and simply pursue God's kingdom.
